Reflection

This week one of our leading politicians said that she is now a 'cultural Christian' having lost faith in God. She went on to say that this happened when she read about Josef Fritzl in Austria who kept his own daughter captive for 24 years, raped her many times and fathered 7 children with her. He is serving life imprisonment for his crime.

I think that throughout the UK and the world there are many 'cultural Christians'. That is, they accept the teachings of Jesus on how we should live our lives. They accept the ten commandments which has formed the basis of our laws and legal system. They accept the 'culture' and traditions of the Christian church, even perhaps attending church services for weddings, funerals, and festivals such as Christmas and Easter. However, they find it difficult to actually believe in God, and to believe that Jesus Christ was of God and came in human form to reveal God's forgiveness and love for us.

When asked why she had lost her faith

in God the politician said that while her prayers were answered for relatively trivial things such as her getting good grades in exams or the bus being on time, the prayers of Josef Fritzl's daughter to God for rescue and release were not.

It is difficult to understand why some prayers are seemingly answered by God but others are not. But if we think about it people pray for outcomes which are often conflicting. In times of war both sides are praying for victory for example. Everyone has the free will to imprison, rape, steal even to kill another human being. If we didn't have that free will we would be like robots programmed to carry out a uniform set of behavior patterns. Everyone would be the same without emotions (regardless of how good they make AI- artificial intelligence). There would be no true love, no families, no close relationships, no drama, no real life worth living. I believe that life and free will is something that has been given by God to each of us through evolution over thousands of years.

If we are not suffering from mental illness or taking mind altering amounts of alcohol or drugs, we can use our free will to either do good or bad things. What makes us decide to control our emotions not to commit crime and harm others is I think a combination of things. The risk of being found out and ending up with a

fine or in prison is one factor which can also bring with it condemnation and isolation from society. But if we believe in God a greater incentive not to commit crime is that it goes against the will of God and we will be judged by God for our actions. Judged not necessarily at the end of our life but now for our behavior and what we have done.

How do we know if how we are conducting our lives, or what we have done goes against God's will? That is where the 10 commandments, many of which are incorporated within other major world religions, and the teachings of Jesus Christ give us the answers and the guide for our lives. Jesus asked the disciples who people said that he was. They said 'one of the prophets' – which was defining Jesus in a cultural context, as someone who went about preaching and healing.

There is a difference between a 'cultural Christian' and one who believes in God and Jesus Christ. It was Peter who told Jesus "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

What do you believe? **Amen**
